VOTE FOR THE STATE DIRECTOR BYLAW*

That Bylaw would change the constituency Directors must please – from the Washington Establishment to the NRA members who elect them. Election to the self-perpetuating NRA Board is determined by the Board-chosen Nominating Committee, not by you voting members. *Every* Director elected for the last four years was chosen by the Nominating Committee – *not one* was elected by member petition nomination.

Any Director who doesn't march in lockstep with the Officers is dropped by the Nominating Committee – and may find himself on a “Do Not Vote For” list in \$20,000 per page advertisements. Those advertisements and mailings to members are funded by “generous contributions” from NRA contractors, vendors and suppliers whose multi-million dollar contracts depend *solely* on keeping the controlling faction in power.

VOTE FOR 'UNTAINTED ELECTIONS' BYLAW*

This second Bylaw would prohibit any company which has large NRA contracts from contributing to NRA internal election campaigns. The leadership has spent an estimated \$250,000 to \$350,000 on internal political campaigns in the last four years – paid with NRA contractors' money. Anyone with a commercial interest in the outcome of NRA elections must not be allowed to influence, *much less control*, our elections.
